After this Crisis, both Sir Tom and my father led ordinary lives whilst seeing many life changes and then, quite unexpectedly, in his 100th year, Sir Tom became Britain's National Hero at another time of Crisis.

We have reflected that the basis of life is the same, but there is progress and we must be mindful that God is with us in every situation. There are more quiet times of life right now in contrast to the demands of the present Covid Crisis. We can all do with God being there with support in the same way we support each other just now.
